# Dear Friends,

In 2024, PETA spent every day working to make a difference for animals – and we succeeded with victories large and small. Our members and supporters allowed us to do all this!

As part of our campaign to end the enormous suffering and high fatality rate of birds in pigeon racing, we put the issue in the news when we took in three pigeons who had been kept in the king's loft at Sandringham. The birds were being auctioned off as part of the British Homing World Show of the Year when PETA won the bid to spare them further exploitation in the racing industry. They're now being given the *royal treatment* in their retirement. We seized the opportunity to publicly appeal to King Charles to cut ties with the blood sport, and to the pigeon racers' chagrin, he heeded our calls and refused royal patronage to the Royal Pigeon Racing Association and the UK's premier club, the National Flying Club.

Following nearly two years of vigorous campaigning by PETA, including demonstrations at annual meetings and across the country, petitions from the public, and support from celebrities including Morrissey, Faye Winter, Olivia Bowen, and Belle Hassan, travel provider Jet2holidays stopped selling tickets to marine parks that confine highly intelligent orcas and other dolphins and whales in the name of entertainment. After working with PETA, another travel provider, easyJet holidays, introduced a new policy against selling tickets to or promoting marine parks, zoos, aquariums, animal rides and performances, or any other activity for which captive animals are used for entertainment or tourist transport.

These are just two examples of how we changed the world for animals in 2024. The following pages provide many more. We're most grateful for your dedication, support, and endless compassion for every single animal.

## **Groundbreaking Victories for Animals**

le for the Ethical

Among PETA's highest priorities is ending experiments on animals. This year, after years of campaigning, we helped to stop the use of the forced swim test as a model of depression and anxiety disorders and its treatment in the UK. The Home Office announced that it will refuse to grant licences for such studies, and the former parliamentary under secretary of state for the Home Office **stated his intention to eliminate all use of the forced swim test** in the future. We'll keep pushing the new government on this issue until that happens.

Animal testing for cosmetics is officially over in the UK for all ingredients used exclusively in cosmetics products, and the Labour Party pledged to work towards phasing out testing on animals and "partner with scientists, industry, and civil society" to reach this goal.

Following PETA's shocking video exposé of frogs in Indonesia being butchered alive so that their legs can be sold in supermarkets, **global supermarket giant Carrefour cut ties with its supplier in Indonesia**. Likewise, after learning about PETA Asia's undercover investigation into the use of forced monkey labour in Thailand's coconut industry, **Co-op agreed not to source Thai coconut milk for its own-brand products**. and more, the company announced that it has committed to no longer sourcing any new down for any of its brands worldwide.

Stella McCartney, one of the world's foremost luxury fashion icons, joined with us to call on all designers to sign PETA's Feather-Free Pledge. Many signed up, including Felder Felder, Eirinn Hayhow, Richard Malone, Patrick McDowell, VIN + OMI, Pīferi, Sarah Regensburger, and Joshua James Small.

After meeting with PETA, organisers of **Copenhagen Fashion Week banned "exotic" skins and wild birds' feathers** from its catwalk.

PETA entities around the globe conducted the **firstever worldwide survey of vegan car interiors**. The results show that after years of cajoling, a significant number of manufacturers – from BMW to Mercedes-Benz and Volvo – **are offering interiors free from wool and leather**. When the UN Committee on the Rights of the Child recommended that children be shielded from "exposure to violence, such as ... violence inflicted on animals," PETA founder Ingrid Newkirk, along with celebrities including **Ricky Gervais**, **Mark Rylance**, and **Twiggy**, sent a letter to then-prime minister Rishi Sunak **urging him to implement legislation prohibiting children from witnessing or participating in hunting activities**.

After hearing from PETA, publisher and greeting card manufacturer **UK Greetings confirmed it has stopped making products featuring unnatural and degrading images of chimpanzees**, which are known to hinder conservation efforts.

PETA's campaigns on behalf of pugs and other breathing-impaired dog breeds picked up steam.

These dogs suffer from numerous health problems that impede their airways and shorten their life expectancy. Among other actions, **PETA supporters held a banner reading "Boycott Breeders" during the "Best in Show" presentation at Crufts**, the world's largest "pedigree" dog show. The action brought national media attention to how breeders intentionally breed deformed, disabled animals for profit.

Following a massive campaign in which thousands of PETA supporters joined masses of others worldwide in taking action, **Anheuser-Busch InBev** – the parent company of iconic American beer brand Budweiser – **stopped amputating Clydesdale horses' tailbones**.

In response to our passionate pleas, **Queen Camilla** confirmed that she will not procure new fur garments for her wardrobe. We also released a

video exposé revealing how black bears in Canada, whose skin is used to make the **King's Guard's caps**, are shot, disembowelled, and dismembered by hunters. We shared the disturbing footage with the Ministry of Defence.

Following dozens of demonstrations by PETA entities at H&M stores around the world, an appeal from Joaquin Phoenix, shareholder resolutions,

We released terrifying footage showing the moment a captive elephant attacked a Russian tourist at the popular tourist site Amer Fort in Jaipur, India. The footage appeared in top media outlets and reminded travellers to stay away from animal rides.

TravelLocal and Exodus Adventure Travels confirmed that they have **ended all camel ride promotions and tours in Egypt**, and PETA continued

> our campaign calling on the Catholic Church to cut its ties with bullfighting.

> PETA is persistent in informing businesses about how today's travellers are attracted to humane and ethical food, services, and experiences. We released **PETA's Travel Awards** to celebrate the travel providers, hotels, attractions, and other industry leaders that are meeting the skyrocketing demand for vegan and animalfriendly travel.

## GLOBAL COMPASSION FUND: Ending Cruelty Begins With Compassion

PETA's Global Compassion Fund helps groups provide animals in dire situations around the world with vital resources.

This year, **PETA's Global Compassion Fund helped** rescue more than 17,000 dogs, cats, goats, horses, and others in Ukraine and delivered food for hungry and often shell-shocked animals. When Kharkiv was under siege, we helped a rescue group **evacuate** more than 800 animals in its care.

**In Petra, PETA supports a free veterinary clinic** that vaccinated dogs during a rabies outbreak, replaced painful chain halters for donkeys and horses with more comfortable harnesses, and sterilised more than 30 cats who were living in squalor.

PETA entities are running **robust spay/neuter programmes** around the world.

- Volunteer pop-up clinics in **Argentina**, **Mexico**, and **Peru** sterilised more than 1,485 animals.
- A **PETA Asia clinic** sterilised 422 animals.
- Since 2021, the Global Compassion Fund has supported 19 spay/neuter clinics,

sterilising more than 5,270 animals, mainly in Mexico, in Yucatán, Southern Mexico, and Zamora. We've provided dog houses, cleaned up living areas, treated dogs for fleas, ticks, and mange – and more.

> PETA India's and Animal Rahat's emergency response teams rescue dogs, cats, cows, bullocks, camels, horses, donkeys, monkeys, and other animals from desperate circumstances. This year, in addition to opening a temporary sanctuary in



Kolkata for horses recovering from neglect and abuse, Animal Rahat **rescued 23 donkeys from toiling in brick kilns, including five who were pregnant**. At its three sanctuaries, **Animal Rahat is now caring for more than 540 animals of 17 species**.

PETA India **replaced working animals with energyefficient, mechanised rickshaws and carriages**. This year, it celebrated the 150<sup>th</sup> animal retired from a lifetime of miserable work.

PETA India rejoiced when Gemini Circus became the first in India to introduce robotic animals. In addition, actors Aindrita Ray, Diganth Manchale, and Priyamani, along with PETA India, donated life-size mechanical elephants to temples that have vowed never to use live elephants in ceremonies.

## **Educating, Persuading, Liberating**

hen either go vegan or put a cork in it.

We're showing people that every animal is someone and deserves to be treated with respect.

If you wouldn't eat a kitten, why eat a fish? That was the message PETA served up in Newcastle on National Fish and Chip Day. We also made headlines around the country when we named our top picks for the UK's best vegan fish and chips.

In honour of World Environment Day, **PETA** plastered 38 billboards across Manchester city centre to remind people that going vegan is one of the best ways to protect the planet.

**PETA received national media attention** for our billboard encouraging a shop selling coffee at Bolton railway station to offer vegan milk.


To help people ditch meat and dairy, we distributed over 9,000 copies of our vegan starter kit.

During Paris Fashion Week, we took over Victoria Beckham's catwalk holding signs and wearing shirts reading, "Viva Vegan Leather", "Animals Aren't Fabric", and "Turn Your Back on Animal Skins". We also disrupted shows by Hermès, Burberry, and Fendi to call on the fashion houses to drop animal-derived materials.

Video footage from our demonstration highlighting that goats scream in pain when they are tied down and their hair is ripped out for cashmere **netted over 51 million views**!

PETA supporters dressed as frogs descended on ITV's annual meeting, calling on the broadcast network to stop allowing animal abuse on I'm a Celebrity ... Get Me Out Of Here.

We offered multiple rewards for information to bring animal abusers to justice, including in relation to an incident in which a peacock



We regularly appeared on television and radio programmes, including *Good Morning Britain*, Sky News, ITV, Talk TV, GB News, BBC Radio, Times Radio, and LBC, to advocate for animal rights.

PETA speaks out for all animals – even the smallest, most-maligned among us. *The Guardian* published a thoughtprovoking piece by PETA founder Ingrid Newkirk in its popular "Why I Quit" section about why she changed her mind about killing insects.

Our campaigns received big boosts from celebrities. Amanda Abbington, Amanda Holden, Kirsty Gallacher, Peter Tatchell, Charlotte Crosby, Gail Porter, Stephen Fry, Ricky Gervais, Twiggy, Jane Horrocks, Mark Rylance, Victoria Scone, and Wallis Day were just some of the stars who joined us to speak out for animals this year.



**PETA India's lifelike animatronic elephant, Ellie, has been on tour in Delhi**, teaching children the importance of empathy. Since her first tour in May 2023, **Ellie has reached a whopping 58,440 young learners** across the country.

Animal Rahat and PETA India are visiting schools throughout India, engaging millions of children through the Compassionate Citizen programme. Animal Rahat hosted several fun-filled field days for children, including those from a local orphanage, who learned about treating all animals with compassion. Students who visited Ranapur and Gundlupet enjoyed delicious vegan lunches donated by actor Alicia Silverstone.
